A note from Mr. Parsons


Creating a Linked in profile is a great way for you to begin networking and tracking your network.

Linkedin Profile Creation

Education:

Highlight your home school. Highlight relevant information (i.e. were you an honour rolls student?) Current educational position would be student at Centennial CVI (at the UGDSB). Describe your leadership development/skills that supports your profile.

Skills:

Highlight your strongest and most relevant skills areas. Be sure that you can support each of this skills with experience or education. You may be asked in an interview.

Recommendations:

Have 3 people write recommendations for your profile. Choose people that will have the credentials and experience to support you in the appropriate manor (not friends and family). Try to select people that know you in different capacities - such a your boss at work, a teacher, and a sport coach.

Awards/Volunteer Work/Interests/Experiences

Highlight any other supportive information that demonstrates your strengths. Have you receive any awards or recognitions? Where have you volunteered/worked? What are you interested in?

Developing your profile should provide you with an opportunity to be reflective on your strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats.
